Features

Create Collection Development Projects from a File

December 2025 Rialto

Rialto now enables users to create retention and deselection projects by uploading a file that contains a predefined list of items. Users can upload a tab-delimited text file or an Excel file with item IDs to serve as the project's data source from which Rialto can generate recommendations. The file must be no larger than 10 MB and include a column named **Item ID** in the header row.

This capability is ideal for libraries that manage curated title lists outside of Rialto—for example, lists exported from previous projects, inventory analyses, or collaborative collection studies.

When creating a new project, a new **Upload Project From File** option is available on the **Add New Project** window (**Collection Development > Workflows > Retention or Deselection**). When selected, the window updates to include a field for uploading a file.

New Upload Project from File option

This enhancement gives libraries greater flexibility when creating collection development projects. Direct file uploads also reduce manual setup time and improve accuracy when analyzing preselected title lists. Create Collection Development Projects from an Alma Set

December 2025 Rialto

In addition to creating a project from a file, users can now also create new projects directly from existing Alma physical item sets. This enhancement applies to both retention and deselection projects.

When creating a new project, a **Create Project from Set** option is now available on the **Add New Project** window (**Collection Development > Workflows > Deselection or Retention**). Once selected, users can choose any Alma set containing physical items from the **Select Physical Items Set** dropdown. When generating recommendations for a project created this way, Rialto evaluates only the items included in the selected Alma set.

Define Usage Scope in Retention Projects



Rialto now enables users to include usage criteria when defining the scope of retention projects. Previously, usage filters were available only for deselection projects.

A new **Suggest when total usage per title is more than** field has been added to the **Scope** section of the retention **Criteria form**. This field includes two dropdowns:

- A usage count dropdown (1–10) that specifies the minimum number of uses per title.
- A timeframe dropdown (1–10 years) that defines the period during which usage is calculated.

The field is optional and is blank by default.

This enhancement helps libraries preserve high-value materials by basing retention decisions on measurable usage patterns.

Include Digitization Requests in Usage Calculations

December 2025 Rialto

Rialto now enables institutions to account for digitization requests when calculating item usage in retention and deselection projects.

A new configuration option, **DIGITIZATION_REQUESTS**, is now available in the table found in **Configuration > Collection Development > Workflows > Usage Calculation**. When enabled, Rialto includes digitization requests in the total usage count used for generating project recommendations.

Digitization requests represent instances where users or staff request the creation of a digital copy of a physical item.

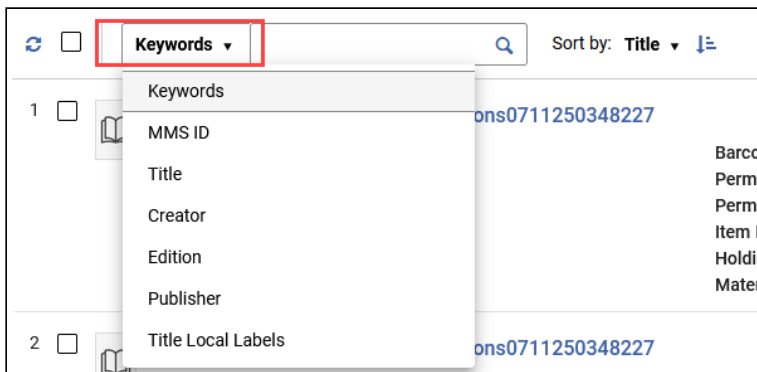
By incorporating digitization requests into the overall usage calculation, libraries gain a more accurate understanding of how their collections are accessed and valued. This helps institutions make better-informed decisions when identifying titles for retention or deselection.

Search Within Recommendations

December 2025 Rialto

Users can now search within the recommendations list in both retention and deselection projects. A new search bar has been added to the **View Recommendations** page, next to the existing sort control. You can search by several indexed fields, including:

- Keywords
- Creator
- Edition
- MMS ID
- Publisher
- Title
- Title Local Labels

Any selected facets remain applied when running a search. If no titles match the entered keywords, the page displays a message indicating that no results were found.

This improvement makes it easier to locate specific titles among large recommendation sets.

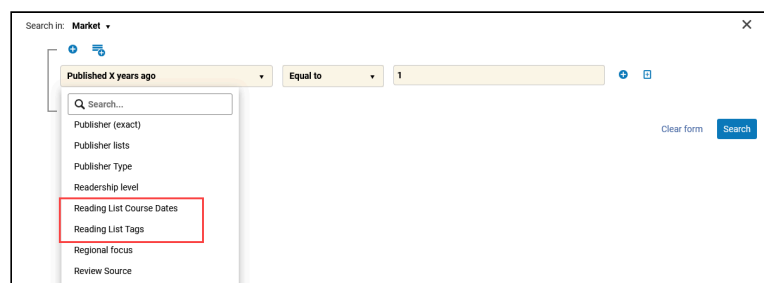
Leganto Integration Enhancements (Early Adoption)

December 2025 Rialto

We are enhancing the integration between Rialto and Leganto to provide greater visibility into course-related materials during marketplace searching and selection.

Two new filters will be in advanced search for institutions that use Leganto:

- **Reading List Course Dates (Current and Future)** — This filter limits search results to titles that appear on either active or upcoming Leganto courses.
- **Reading List Tags** — This filter enables libraries to refine results based on tags applied in Leganto. Institutions define these tags themselves.

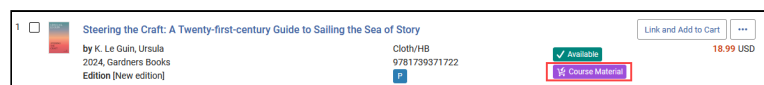


Two new filters

Items that appear in reading lists will display a **Course Material** badge on both the work and offer levels. This badge provides immediate awareness that the title is required or recommended for one or more active or future courses. On hover, the **Course Material** badge will list all course codes associated with the item.

The **Course Material** badge will appear even when users are not searching with the new course-related filters; any title included in the weekly Leganto feed will display the badge whenever it appears in marketplace search results.

If an item displays the **Course Material** badge, users will see the new **Link and Add to Cart** action. Selecting it will link the purchase to all relevant citations and advance their statuses within both Leganto and Alma. The offer will then display a **Linked Reading List** badge, indicating that the purchase is associated with one or more citations.



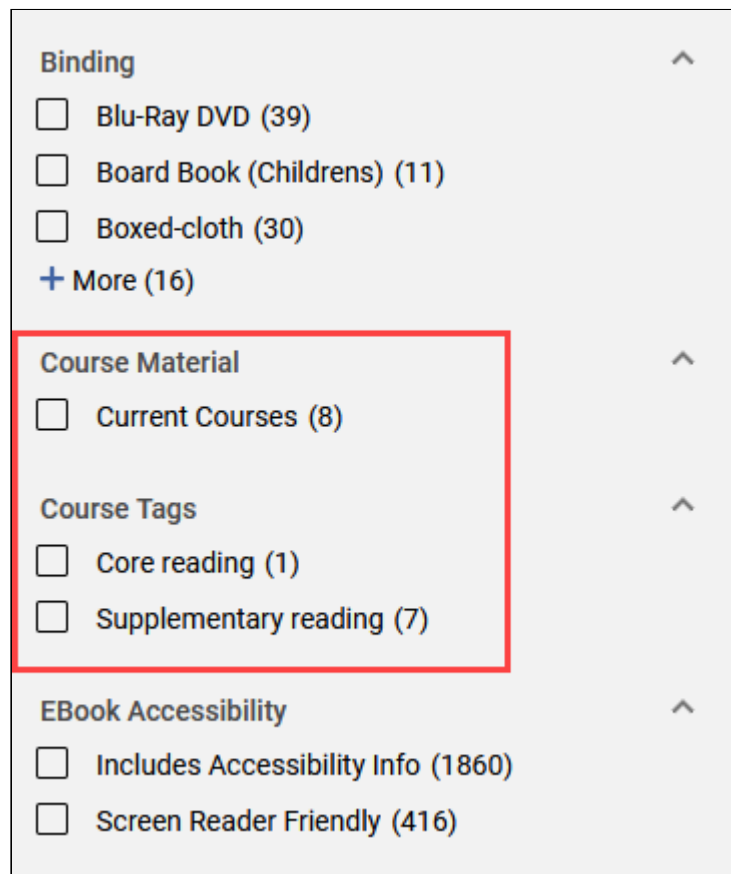
Linked Reading List badge

A new parameter, **allow_citation_link_for_alternate_isbn** ([Configuration > Collection Development > General > Other Settings](#)), will control how Rialto determines whether a purchased offer can fulfill a Leganto citation:

- When set to `true`, Rialto will allow the **Link and Add to Cart** action to close a citation even when the purchased offer uses an alternate but equivalent ISBN (for example, a different format or edition).
- When set to `false`, only an exact ISBN match from the Leganto citation feed will be considered valid for linking and fulfillment. `false` will be the default setting for this parameter.

Additionally, two new facets will be available on marketplace pages:

- **Course Material** — Enables users to filter for items that appear on Leganto reading lists
- **Course Tags** — Enables users to filter items by custom tags applied to their associated citations

These enhancements will strengthen support for course-driven purchasing and help libraries identify course-dependent titles at an earlier stage.

Share an Offer by Email

December 2025 Rialto

Rialto now supports a new **Share in Email** action at the offer level. This feature enables users to easily share individual offers with colleagues directly through Alma.



New Share in Email button

Selecting **Share in Email** opens a form where you can search for a recipient by name or email and optionally add a personalized message in the **Description** field. Users can check the **Send me a copy** checkbox to receive a copy of the email themselves. After you select **Send**, the recipient receives a system-generated message that includes a link to that specific offer in Rialto.

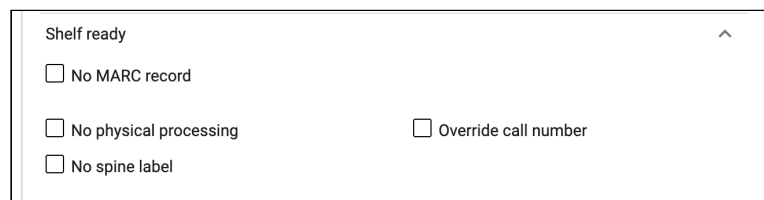

Hide Shelf Ready Options in the Cart for North America

December 2025 Rialto

To better facilitate drop shipping print books from an alternate print supplier, we have hidden the **Shelf ready** options for customers who are configured to receive orders from the North American warehouse. **Shelf ready** will not appear in the cart, **Orders Awaiting Approval** or as an option in profiles. The Rush option has also been hidden.

Improved Availability Display for Drop Shipping Print Stock

December 2025 Rialto

We will soon update availability messaging to more accurately reflect drop-shipping print stock available to North American institutions. These changes will not affect how availability displays for institutions outside North America.

When a print title is not available for ordering, the offer will display **Not Available** using the same brown badge color as **Out of Print** items. The offer details and hover text will indicate: **Not available from supplier. Orders not accepted.** The **Add to Cart** action will be disabled for these offers to prevent attempts to order titles that cannot be fulfilled.

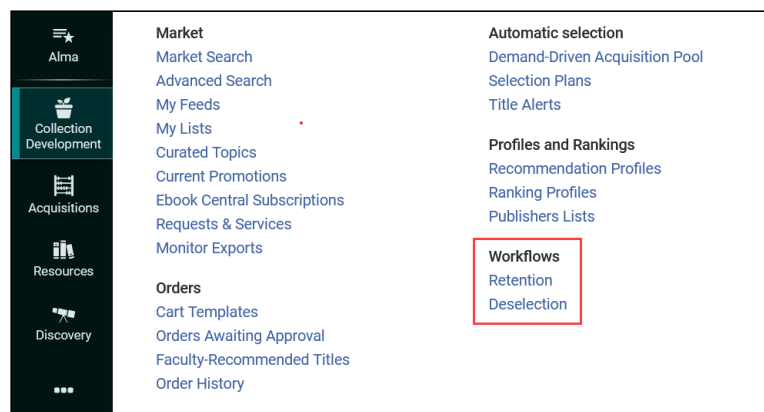

Introducing Collection Development Workflows

November 2025 Rialto

We are introducing brand-new collection development workflows to Rialto, located in **Collection Development > Workflows**. These workflows are available to all Alma users, regardless of whether they have access to the Rialto marketplace.

Collection development workflows become visible in the **Collection Development** menu once an Alma administrator updates the institution's **Data Sharing Profile** settings. For instructions, see [Enabling Collection Development Workflows](#).



Collection development workflows

Two workflows are currently available: **Retention** and **Deselection**.

Retention enables libraries to identify important items in their collections and maintain a minimum number of copies of key titles. Use this workflow when you want to:

- Safeguard unique and high-value titles
- Establish minimum holdings for high-demand items
- Participate in collaborative retention projects with partner institutions

Deselection helps libraries identify items suitable for permanent or temporary removal from their collections. Use this workflow when you want to:

- Remove low-value or underused items
- Reduce unnecessary duplication
- Simplify inventory management

New Provider Configuration Page

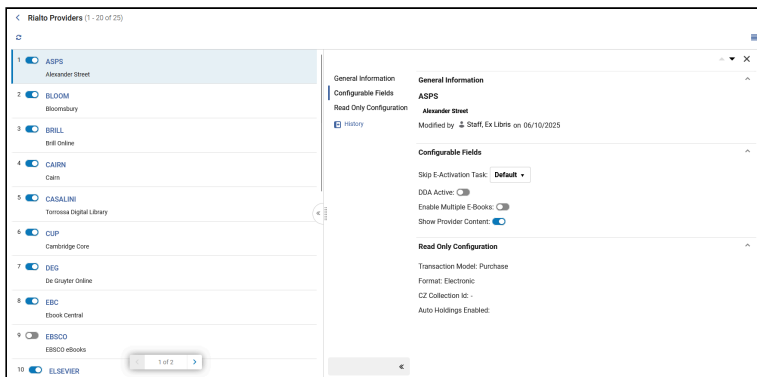

Rialto now includes a new **Provider Configuration** page ([Configuration > Collection Development > Provider Configuration](#)). This page replaces the previous **Skip E-Activation** page and provides a centralized location where administrators can view and manage platform configurations.

Provider Configuration enables you to:

- Review which electronic platforms are configured for your institution
- Control whether content from specific providers is displayed in the Rialto Marketplace
- View transaction model and format information for each platform



New Provider Configuration page

The new page is divided into two main areas. The left panel lists all electronic platforms available to the institution. Toggles next to platform names indicate whether the platform is configured. These toggles are read-only.

On the right panel, there is the expandable **Sections** area, which includes three parts:

- **General Information** – Displays the platform name and the date it was last modified.
- **Configurable Fields** – Allows administrators to adjust selected settings (**Skip E-Activation Task**, **DDA Active**, **Enable Multiple E-Books**, **Show Provider Content**).
- **Read-Only Configuration** – Displays non-editable reference information such as **Transaction Model**, **Format**, **CZ Collection ID**, and **Auto-Holdings Enabled**.

This enhancement enables you to more effectively manage what content appears in Rialto and provides better oversight of all configured provider relationships in one location. For additional details, see [Provider Configuration](#).

Ebook Accessibility Metadata

November 2025 Rialto

Rialto now supports the display and export of ebook accessibility compliance metadata. This enhancement provides libraries with greater transparency into accessibility information supplied by publishers, enabling more informed purchasing decisions.

A new **Ebook Accessibility** section has been added throughout the Rialto marketplace, including:

- New search filters and facets under **Ebook Accessibility**, allowing users to refine results by:
 - **Includes Accessibility Info**

- **Screen Reader Friendly**

Improved Click Behavior for Offer-Level Items

Previously, clicking anywhere within an offer field could trigger an action. Now, actions can only be initiated by clicking directly on the item title or selecting the main call-to-action button (for example, **View all offers** or **Add to cart**).

New List Types Added to Curated Topics

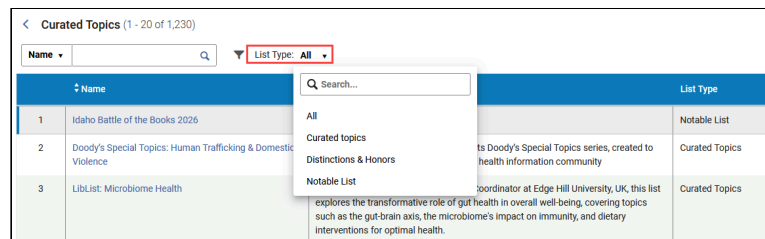

Rialto now includes two additional list types in the Curated Topics section: **Distinctions & Honors** and **Notable Lists**. These lists are sourced from Syndetics Unbound and are defined as follows:

- **Distinctions & Honors** lists feature books that have received formal recognition through major literary awards or honors.
- **Notable Lists** present titles recommended by trusted media outlets, organizations, or critics. These lists primarily reflect influence and popularity instead of formal awards.

These additional list types provide access to high-quality, thematically organized content and make it easy to explore critically recognized and culturally significant titles.

A new List Type column has been introduced to Curated Topics to distinguish between different list types. Users can filter results by list type using the new List Type filter.

New Configuration to Suppress Internal Notes from Reading and Citation Lists

September 2025 Rialto

A new setting has been added to allow automatic suppression of internal notes generated when items are added to the cart from reading and citation lists. This update addresses feedback from users who prefer not to manually remove these notes during the ordering process.

The setting, located under **Configuration > Collection Development > General > Other Settings**, is labeled **suppress_internal_note_from_reading_list**. By default, it is set to `false`, but institutions can enable it to streamline cart management and reduce unnecessary manual steps.

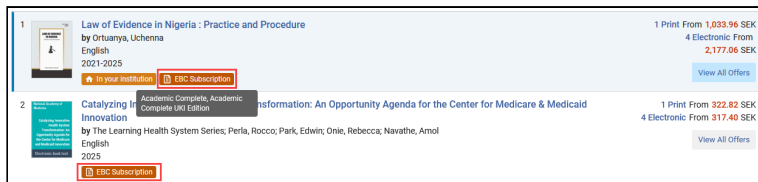
The New Parameter for Suppressing Internal Notes

EBC Subscription Badges Now Visible at the Work Level

September 2025 Rialto

To ensure continued awareness of Ebook Central (EBC) subscription access, Rialto now displays EBC subscription badges at the work level, in addition to existing offer-level badges.

The work-level badge appears for titles included in EBC collections owned by the institution or its consortia parent. Users can hover over the badge to view full collection details, replicating the behavior already available at the offer level.

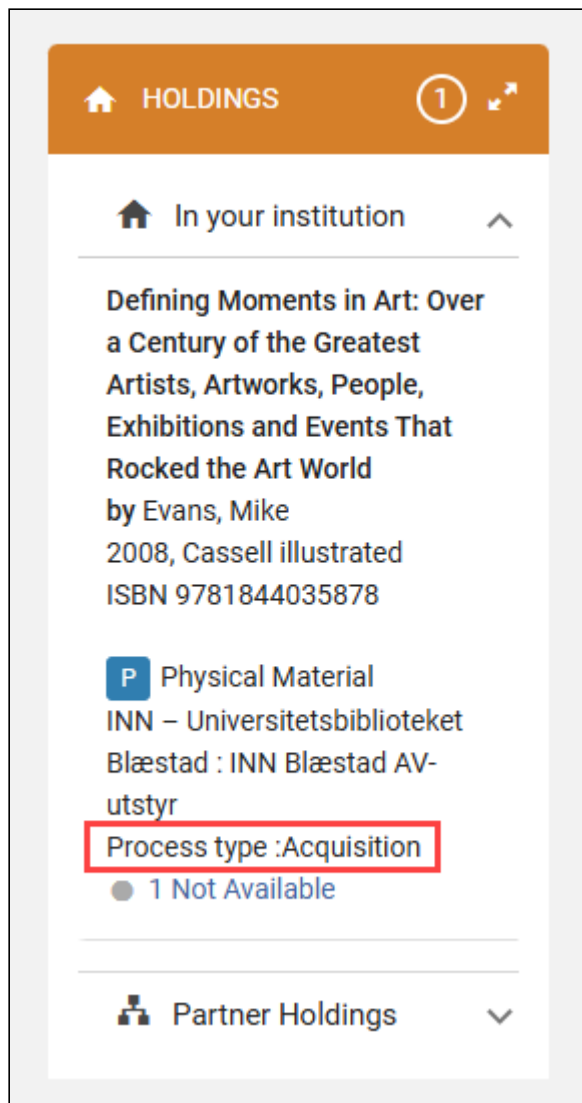


EBC Subscription Badges at the Work Level

Item Process Types Now Displayed in Holdings Panel

The Holdings panel in the Marketplace now displays the item process type from Alma (e.g., Missing, Lost, Claimed Returned, Loan, Hold Shelf, Acquisition).

Copy-Paste for Profile Rules

Rules that are defined for a profile using Query Builder, such as rules included in a Selection Plan or a Title Alert, can now be copied and pasted into the same or other profiles. Rules can be copied individually or as groups that include the logical relationships between the rules. The copied rules can be pasted into a selection plan or other profile, or they can be pasted into a text file for transmission to other environments.

To copy a rule, hover over the rule, and then, when the controls appear to its right, select **Copy rule** (



). To copy a group of rules, above the group, select **Copy group** (



).

Copy Group Button Above a Group of Rules

You can paste a copied rule or group of rules below any existing rule or group of rules in a profile. To paste them below an existing rule, hover over the rule, and then, when the controls appear to its right, select **Paste** (



). To paste them below an existing group of rules, above the existing group, select **Paste** (

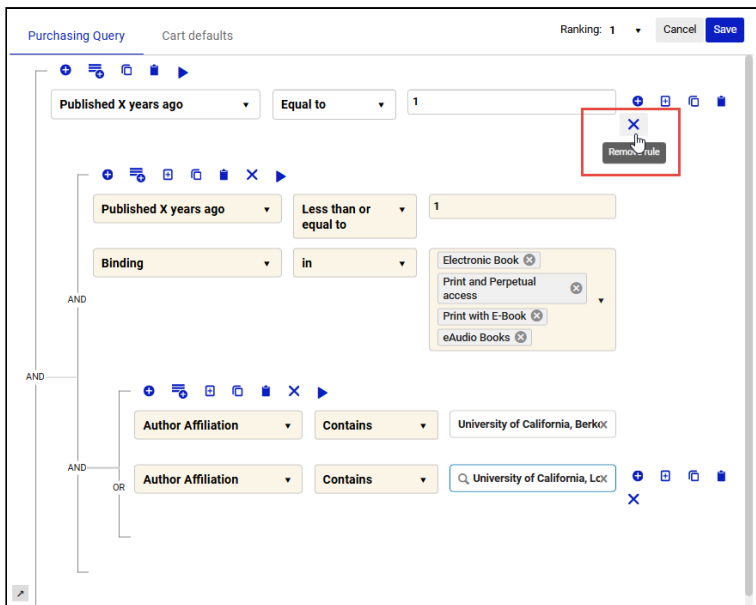


).

Note that if you want to *replace* existing rules with the rules you are pasting, you must do this in two steps: first paste the copied rules, and then use the **Remove rule / Remove group** (



) option to delete the existing rules. If the rule you want to delete is the top-level group of the profile, hover over the group to display the editing controls, and then select the **Remove rule** button.

Copied rules are formatted in JSON and can be viewed and saved by pasting them into a text file. The JSON can later be copied from the file and pasted into a profile, as described above.

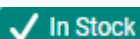

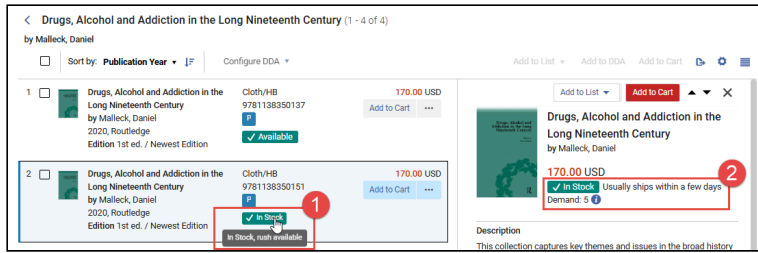

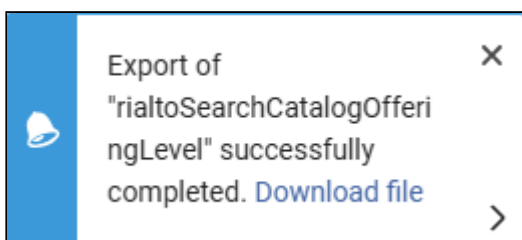
Progress Dialog Box

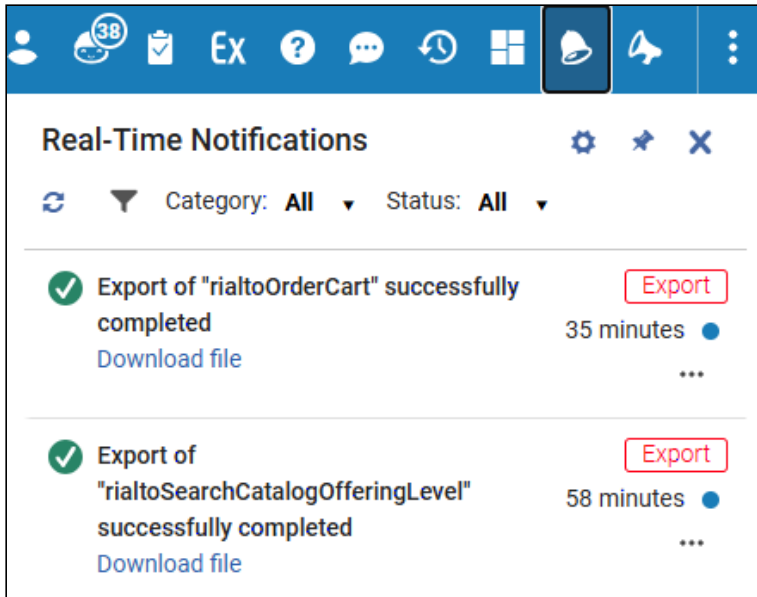





Predicted to Be Treated Search Category

March 2025 Rialto

A new search category has been added to the Query Builder: **Predicted to be treated**. This new category enables you to search Rialto's index specifically for works that have not yet been reviewed by the New Title team, but have characteristics that make it likely that they will be treated by the team in the near future, such as publishers, subject areas, and historical sales data. The more a title's properties are similar to those of titles that were treated in the past, the higher it is ranked in the list of items that are **Predicted to be treated**. This ranking reflects the expected overall value of an untreated title; applying it in a title search filters the results so that they prioritize the works that are most likely to be required by your institution.

When you use this feature, you choose the maximum number of items that the search should return: from 500,000 to 3,000,000. The larger the number of items you choose to return, the broader the range of rankings in the list, and, thus, the lower the chances that any particular offer in the list will be treated by the New Titles team.

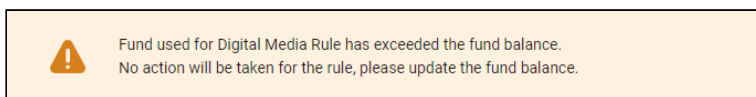

Collection to Vendor Mapping Update

Rialto introduces enhancements to ensure alignment between collection configurations for vendor and auto-holdings. The changes aim to improve consistency in electronic resource management and streamline portfolio handling. For new customers, the Out-of-the-Box (OTB) settings have been refined to ensure uniformity in Community Zone (CZ) collection assignments for vendor and auto-holdings. Current customers can update their collection IDs manually or reach out to [Rialto Support](#) for assistance in making these changes.

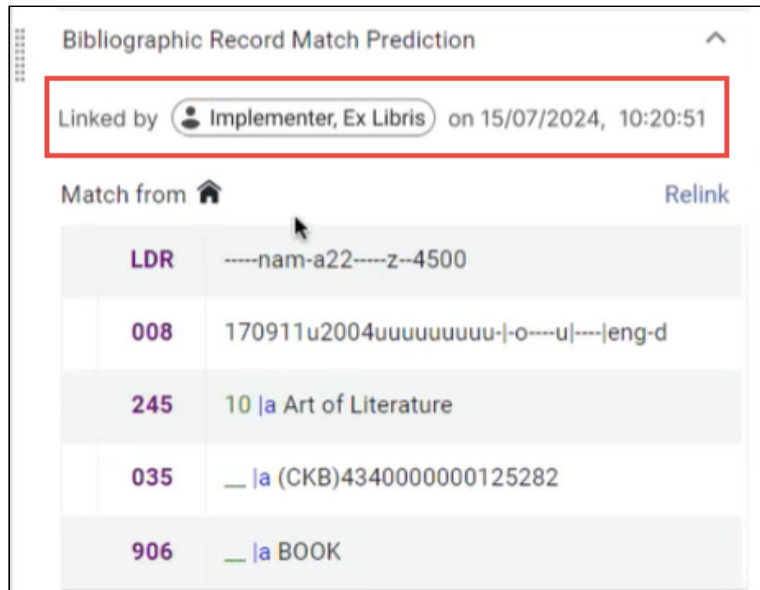
Display Relink User Indication

Order History pages display a notification detailing the action. The notification includes a message confirming the relink/manual link, the user's name who performed the action, and the date it was completed.

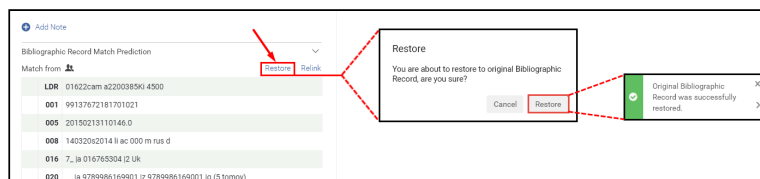

Restore Original MMS ID After Relinking

Rialto introduces a **Restore** button that appears after a user performs a relink, enabling retrieval of the original MMS ID that was matched. The restore action reverts to the original bibliographic record (BIB) and includes a confirmation popup to confirm the user's intent. Upon completion, a success or failure message is displayed to indicate the outcome of the action.

Rialto PO Approval Date and Time Analytics Field Now Available

January 2025 Analytics and Insights

The **Rialto PO Approval Date and Time** field was added to Rialto Acquisitions > Rialto PO Line. It displays the date and time that the PO was approved.

Resolved Issues

- **December 2025 Rialto**
Order History previously displayed an incorrect status indicating that some POLs were cancelled, even though they had already been cancelled by the user. This has been corrected.
- **November 2025 Rialto**
When performing a market search with the **Award Name** filter, the results page and Quick Analytics displayed the award ID instead of the award name. This was fixed so that the award name is now displayed instead of the ID number.
- **November 2025 Rialto**
In some cases, failed orders triggered the system to send multiple **Purchase Request Status Letters** even though the PO line was not created successfully. This was fixed to prevent letters from being sent when PO line creation fails.
- **November 2025 Rialto**
When performing an advanced market search using an Ebook Central subscription collection name, the EBC subscription badge appeared only on the first or second result instead of on all relevant work-level records. This was fixed so that the badge now displays consistently for every record that includes an EBC subscription item.
- **September 2025 Rialto**
After refining a **Quick Search** by Award, Collection, Publisher List, Platform, or Partner Holdings, the UI displayed the ID instead of the name. This was fixed to ensure the selected name displays correctly in the results.
- **August 2025 Rialto**
When enabled, the **Allow Duplicate** checkbox was appearing on offers without holdings for some customers. Additionally, an error message would appear when the box was unchecked. This issue has been resolved and the checkbox no longer appears when there are no holdings.
- **August 2025 Rialto**
When a selection plan generates no results, users now receive a notification indicating that the snapshot is empty.
- **August 2025 Rialto**
Following the "Awards Refresh with Syndetics Data" in the [November 2024 release](#) and the "New Awards Fields in the Query Builder" in the [June 2025 release](#), we have made manual adjustments to profiles (recommendation, selection plan, and title alerts) to accommodate awards that are still supported but have changed names. There are, however, a small number of awards used in profiles that are no longer present. If any of these award names were present, the award name line now appears as: "Award Name" "Contains" with no award name following. The profiles continue to return results and run as if that award line is omitted from the query. The awards no longer supported are:

- **July 2025 Rialto**

When upgrades of multiple owned electronic titles were moved in bulk to the cart, they were added as new purchases rather than upgrades. As a result, customers were overcharged, and refunds had to be issued to them afterwards. This was fixed.

- **July 2025 Rialto**

In selection plans, when a rule was duplicated, and the copied version was edited, the changes made in the copied version were also implemented in the original rule. This was fixed.

- **June 2025 Rialto**

Selection plan performance was improved overall. Adjustments were made to reduce failures and to prevent race conditions that resulted from timeouts. (The race conditions caused titles that were previously selected on a snapshot to appear again on the next snapshot. The title was not ordered twice as a result, but it was confusing for users.)

- **May 2025 Rialto**

The labels of some fields in the purchase request form were not translated when the UI language was changed. This was fixed.

- **May 2025 Rialto**

The description of the Rialto Purchaser role that appears in the User Details page (**Admin > User Management > Manage Users > [select user] > General tab > Add Role**) was corrected from "Implementor role" to "May submit orders without approval."

- **May 2025 Rialto**

Under certain circumstances, Rialto created or deleted bib records when it should not have done so. This was fixed.

- **April 2025 Rialto**

The operators in the Query Builder were displayed in English regardless of the language of the rest of the interface. This was fixed. The operators now appear in the language of the interface.

- **March 2025 Rialto**

4th and 5th reporting codes were not included in invoices. This was fixed.

- **March 2025 Rialto**

A performance issue involving selection-plan order-submission and snapshot generation caused some orders to be incorrectly marked as failed in the order history. This was fixed.

- **February 2025 Rialto**

A regression occurred where Selection Plan DDA rules were validated against the associated fund. This prevented titles from being added to the pool at the time the snapshot was created. This behavior has now been corrected. Items added to a DDA pool are no longer validated against the associated funds.
