Description:

How can I view and reset MySQL passwords in SFX version 3?

Resolution:

Mysql passwords are encrypted, it's not possible to check what they are in version 3. By default, they are identical to the unix user names or database names (i.e. sfxglc3 would be the mysql password of the sfxlc3 instance, regardless of whether the instance has a public alias such as sfx_local). For resetting/changing mysql passwords, you should use our server_admin_util tool, option 3 (Change passwords). To do this, please follow our instructions in the SysAdmin Guide, section 4.4.2 .
