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## Adding Page Components

Creative Studio includes an extensive set of components that enable you to build your page in a matter of minutes. You can simply drag-and-drop components into their place on the page using the WYSIWYG display. A single component can include one or more elements.

You can add components to template-based pages or blank pages (pages that begin from the blank template).

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## Components Overview

### To view the components menu:

Select the tiles icon from the tools menu.

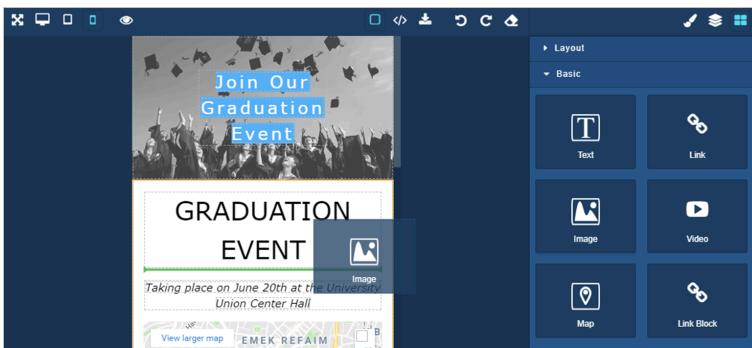


### To add components to the page:

Drag-and-drop them into their relevant position, as shown in the screenshot below.

Creative Studio's WYSIWYG display uses nested elements, enabling you to add components and elements into existing ones for a better page layout. For example, you can add a text area and a map into a simple one-column layout.

The green highlighted line indicates the drop position of your component.






If you select any element on the page (and not the contents of the element), an edit menu appears. See [Editing and Configuring Page Elements](#).





	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Link</b> - A text link. Enter the text and target window for the link. Enter a URL or select the link icon to enter or select an app URL. See <a href="#">Working with App URLs</a>.</li> </ul>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Image</b> - An image; when you add this element, the Asset Manager opens, enabling you to select a previously uploaded image. You can select an HTML5, Youtube, or Vimeo source for the video. <p><b>Sections</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Color sections - Colored sections with text boxes, stacked vertically.</li> </ul>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Square sections - Sections stacked vertically. Each one has a header text box and several smaller text boxes underneath.</li> </ul>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Square sections - Sections stacked vertically, with simple text boxes with centered text.</li> </ul> 	<p>Section components can be used for information pages with multiple topics, enabling you to easily segment the page between the different sections.</p> <p>These components are premade combinations of components from the first two sections (Layout and Basic).</p> <p>For all components, you can specify an ID and title.</p>
<p><b>Events</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>List (With Links) - A series of vertical text boxes with links, useful for an events calendar.</li> </ul>	<p>Event components provide a great way to design pages for one or multiple days' events. They provide the required layout including date, times of the day, and more.</p>

	 <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• List (No Links) - The same as List (With Links), but no links.</li> <li>• Event Day - An image with text boxes that looks like a calendar day.</li> </ul> 	<p>These components are premade combinations of components from the first two sections (Layout and Basic).</p> <p>For all components, you can specify an ID and title.</p>
<p><b>Tables</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 2 Columns - A series of text boxes, arranged like an itinerary.</li> </ul>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 3 Columns - A table of text boxes with three columns.</li> </ul> 	<p>Table components provide a designed layout for all purposes.</p> <p>These components are premade combinations of components from the first two sections (Layout and Basic).</p> <p>For all components, you can specify an ID and title.</p>
<p><b>Advanced</b></p>	<p>Custom Code - A freeform element that enables you to enter any HTML code that you like.</p> <p>When you add this element, a pane enters to enter your code.</p>  <p>The result appears on the page.</p>  <p>For this element, an extra icon</p>  <p>appears in the element edit menu. Select to open the HTML editing pane.
