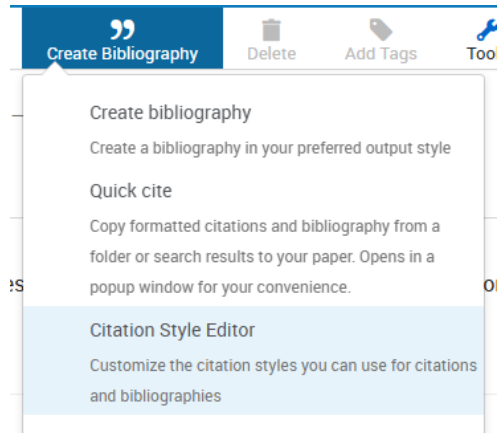


Adding new styles to RefWorks Citation Manager (RCM)

If you do not see a style in RefWorks Citation Manager (RCM) for Word or Google Docs, first make sure the style you are looking for is available to you in RefWorks.

Click on Create Bibliography -> Citation Style Editor

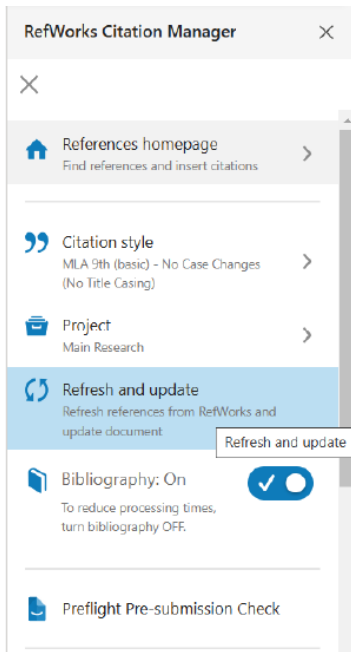

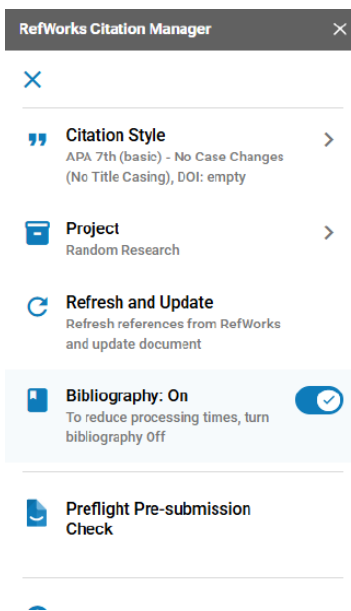
Once you verify you have access to the style you need, simply log out and then log in to RCM.

Every time you log in to **RCM**, it is automatically updated to show your your RefWorks references and citation styles.

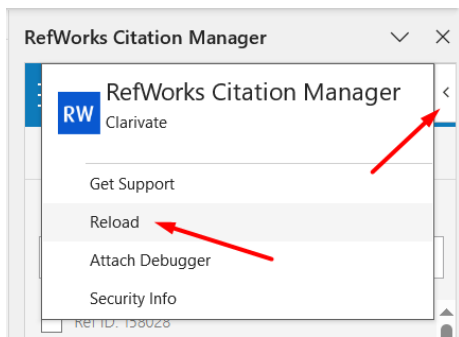
You may also update manually by clicking on **Refresh and Update** option in the Main Menu, or Reload on the Microsoft menu in RCM for Word on desktop.
