
What is a quick and easy way to add reference details in RefWorks?


RefWorks users who have a reference title, DOI, ISSN or ISBN, can use the "Find and complete reference" feature to find reference matches and details.

Here the title is being entered after which the user clicks on the button.

Note: If using this feature for existing references to supplement data, when clicking on **Title** in the suggestion list, the contents of the reference will be replaced.

When clicking on ISSN, ISBN or DOI, the contents of the reference will be supplemented. We recommend [duplicating a reference](#) before using the **Title** look up, to prevent any data from being overwritten.
