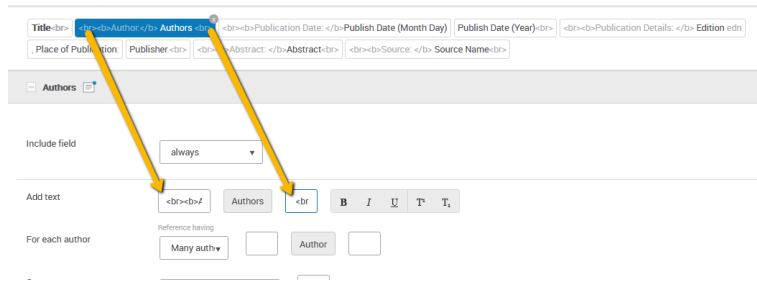


Adding line breaks (carriage return) in a citation style

Currently in the RefWorks Citation Style Editor line breaks are added manually to a citation style, using the line break HTML code `
` following the field after which the line break.

In this example, a line break is being added before and after the author field to create a separate line.



The result will create a line of information that will then break off and start again.

Please note that edits to one reference type must be added to all reference type definitions in the style. This will ensure the update is applied to all types of entries saved in RefWorks.
